Alameda Little League Pitch Count Procedure

Effective immediately, Managers, Scorekeepers and Umpires in Major, AAA, and AA will follow these Pitch Count Procedures. Failure to follow these procedures may result in adverse rulings, including pitcher or catcher ineligibility and possible forfeiture due to use of ineligible pitchers or players:

- Official Scorekeepers announce the number of pitches made after each half inning, making sure that the Managers hear and acknowledge
- Official Scorekeepers announce the total number of pitches at the time the player is removed as a pitcher including any "threshold" number (see Regulation VI, c. Exception)
- Official Scorekeepers announce if a pitcher has reached maximum limit, see Regulation VI g. (in AAA and AA, also innings limit)
- Official Scorekeepers announce if a pitcher is ineligible to catch (exceeds 40 pitches, subject to threshold exception)
- Official Scorekeepers announce if a catcher has caught more than 3 innings (ineligible to pitch)
- Official Scorekeepers announce if a catcher who legally moves to pitcher has pitched more than 20 pitches (ineligible to return to catcher, subject to threshold exception)
- Official Scorekeepers to enter the number of pitches for each pitcher on a team's <u>Pitching Eligibility Form</u> and sign (Umpire does not need to sign)
- Both Managers to sign <u>Pitching Eligibility Form</u>. Number of pitches may be appealed to the President only with proof, make note on the form if appeal is being made to the President

Daily Pitch Limits By League-Age:

13 years old - 95 pitches per day

11-12 years old - 85 pitches per day

09-10 years old - 75 pitches per day

07-08 years old - 50 pitches per day

Days Rest Requirements 'Thresholds':

01-20 pitches in a day - no rest required

21-35 pitches in a day - 1 calendar day of rest required

36-50 pitches in a day - 2 calendar days of rest required

51-65 pitches in a day - 3 calendar days of rest required
